



About Europe Mobile

Europe-Mobile offers an exciting European experience for pupils and students. Each year, a group of 20 students from different EU member states visits several schools in a European region by bus, the Europe-Mobile, to run workshops on European issues. **In 2018 Europe-Mobile returns once again to Germany, to the land of Brandenburg (around Berlin).**

Europe-Mobile aims to enhance students' commitment to and pupils' interest in European affairs by making Europe tangible. Moreover, Europe-Mobile reveals concrete chances for pupils how to get mobile in Europe. Through their cooperation in the context of Europe-Mobile students and pupils get to know their neighbouring countries and their people better. It is a way to increase their motivation to become active European citizens and to produce critical enthusiasm for the European idea.

Europe-Mobile offers practical experience in teaching and in project management in an international environment. All participants may enrich their knowledge about European issues by participating in discus-



sions with invited experts. A weeklong introductory seminar includes training units on project management, on pedagogical methods and on EU issues. Europe-Mobile also gives an opportunity to build an international network and to reinforce intercultural skills.

The 2018 edition in brief

1. Educational Training | 04.-11.09.2018

A weeklong introductory seminar includes training units on project management, on pedagogical methods and on EU issues preparing the students for their work on the ground in the classrooms. Additionally, students create workshops focusing on European issues with professional support.

2. School visits | 12.-26.09.2018

For around two weeks students will visit one school per day, running workshops on European issues for pupils from the age of 14 to 18. The workshops focus on key European issues like: How does the EU work?; cultural diversity and European identity; migration in Europe; democracy and populism in Europe. In addition to the workshops, European associations will inform pupils about opportunities to become mobile in Europe at an information fair in each school.

3. Final Conference | 27.09.2018

The project will end with a final conference that involves representatives from politics and civil society at which the students present the results of their work.

Who can apply?

The project is directed to students of all subject areas who have a strong interest in Europe and the European Union. Prior engagement in projects related to the European Union as well as experience in teaching and working with pupils are an asset but not required.

What languages skills are needed?

The project language is English. Workshops at schools will also be given in English. Hence the students should have a very good command of English. Other language skills are also welcome.

How can I apply?

To apply please fill in the enclosed application form and attach:

- a letter of motivation (max. 1 page)
- a brief outline of your experiences and qualifications which might be useful for the project
- an outline of an idea for a workshop, simulation game or seminar, that you would like to realize with pupils aged between 14 and 18. It should last about 90 minutes and suit a group of 20-30 people. You may either write a text or create a short presentation.
- a brief outline of two topics that you would present during a 15 minutes long presentation to make pupils become familiar with your country.
- your CV

The deadline for applications is 17 June 2018 and successful candidates will be notified by early July 2018.

Depending on the university, the participation may be recognised as an internship or an ECTS equivalent.
